## Strengths

#### Weaknesses

- Pavements being taken over by the homeowner's hedges. The pavements are small enough in some places so having half of it covered in a hedge doesn't help people to walk around safely
- Parking on pavements very naughty
- Dog mess, please use dog mess bins
- No safe car parking area not even around the new pay area
- No dog walking area it would be good for example to put a dog walking area around the improved play area
- No cycle paths
- EDF! Lorries, bypass cutting access to Cannington Park, Brymore School eyesore
- No cycle paths in village or to Bridgwater
- More dog bins!
- Lack of public transport after about 18.00
- Lack of cycle paths, not just to Bridgwater, but to other villages also
- No traffic calming in Main Road to reduce speed
- Poor lighting in the area of the village hall and Walled Garden
- pedestrian lights at Newsagents and Church footpath
- Sort the parking out i.e. people parking <u>both</u> sides of the road opposite the Newsagents
- Busy main road
- No parking for school
- Not enough homes!!!

#### **Opportunities**

- Affordable housing to attract and keep young people on the village
- More green areas
- maintain village 'feel'
- College, school etc. no need to go into Bridgwater self-sufficient (almost)
- More affordable housing
- Affordable housing for youngsters to stay in the village, and not have to move out

- make sure once bypass work completed <u>all traffic</u>, except local traffic in to the village, is directed via the bypass with immediate effect once work completed
- To control the development of affordable housing

### Threats

- Increased traffic because of Hinkley developments
- Increase in traffic
- Unplanned growth of population impact on school and GPs
- Too much development of unaffordable housing
- EDF ruining village traffic
- Flooding outlet from Mill stream small plastic pipe gets blocked and run-off slope overgrown with grass so doesn't drain effectively
- The stretch of road between the bottom of Rodway up to the bus stop on Brook Street really needs looking at including the turning into East Street, recent events have proved this
- EDF short term thinking with regard to transport issues
- EDF uncaring, un swaying, threatening
- development of affordable housing to the detriment of Cannington as a village <u>without</u> adequate control of policy driven development - the village will become the accommodation hub for EDF
